OUR MISSION STATEMENT

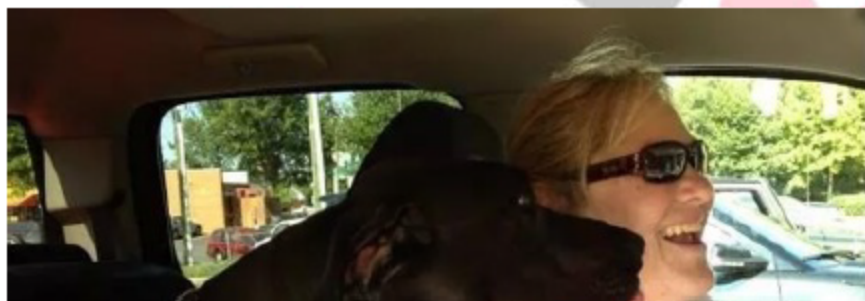
Establish a Service, Assistance and Therapy Dog program for those who have disabilities.

Establish a Disaster Relief Program to provide temporary emergency care and shelter.

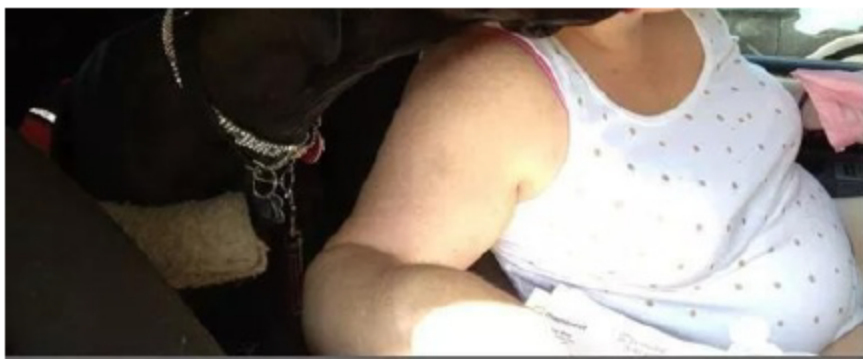
Establish a Program to Reduce the Number of Animals being abandoned or sent to shelters or killed.

Recent Rescue News: Summer, 2014

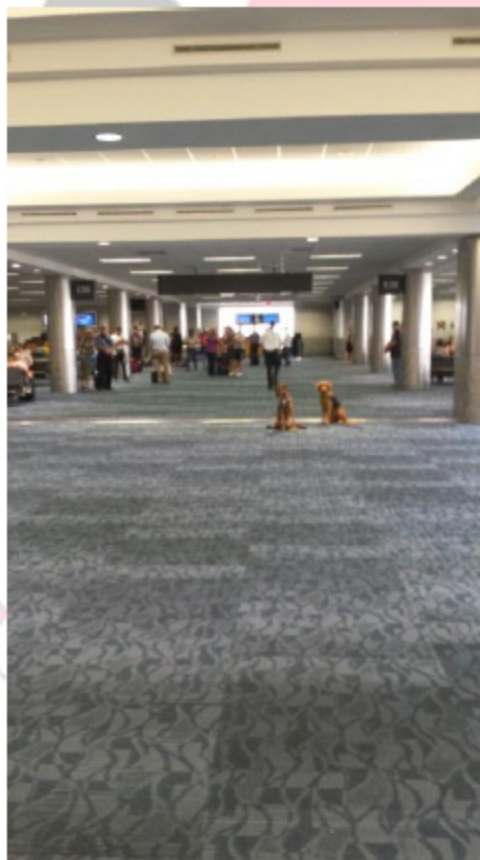

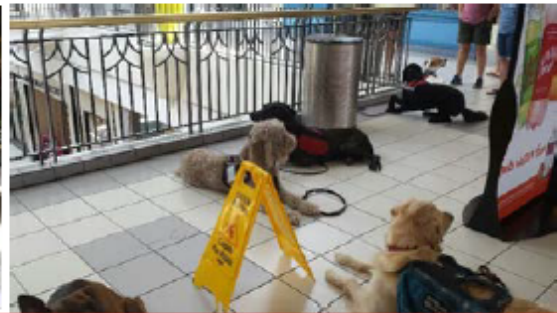

Keeping Your Pet Healthy and Happy: When Summer is Over...

Healthy Tips

Even as the weather starts to cool down, we need to make sure we pay attention to our dogs' needs. The car is not an appropriate place to keep your dog, especially while the weather is still hot. Even if it is only 80 degrees outside, your car can become overwhelmingly hot and stuffy for your dog. We suggest keeping your dog with you as much as possible, but if you know you are going to have to leave your dog in the car – even for just a minute – it is wiser to let your dog hang out in the air conditioning at home.

If your dog spends a lot of time outdoors, we cannot stress the importance of keeping water available enough. Always make sure your dog has plenty of clean water to drink from, and make sure you do not let your dog drink from puddles or standing bodies of water; these can contain harmful pollution, mosquito larvae, bacteria, and any number of microorganisms that can harm your dog.

As the weather cools, we will see a drop in the number of bugs outside. While that makes life easier for everyone, make sure you keep your dog on flea protection and heartworm preventative. The few bugs that are left over can still get your dog!

Back to School

As kids go back to school, we get back to work, and our dogs need to readjust their schedules. The

easiest way to make that transition is to keep as much of your dog's life on schedule. Keep meal times consistent, try to go out at roughly the same times every day, and keep bed time consistent. The more consistency in your dog's schedule, the better they will feel – and the easier it will be for you to care for them!

If you need to be out for extended periods of time, try leaving your dog something to keep busy; a toy and a bone should suffice. By giving your dog something of their own, you will avoid coming home to a mess that was made out of boredom!

Halloween is Coming up!

Although it seems a long way away, we want to remind you all of Halloween, and the safety tips you need to keep your dog happy. Make sure you keep chocolate out of sight, smell, and reach for your dogs. Also make sure your dog is comfortable with people coming and ringing the doorbell; if not, then set up a baby gate to keep trick-or-treaters happy, and your dog comfortable in a room where it will not be bothered.

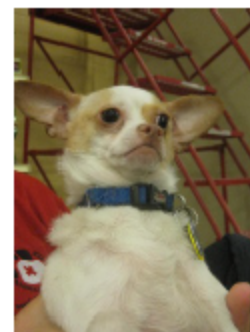

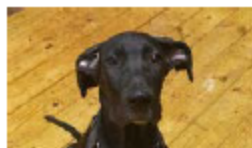
